4TH ANNUAL INTERGENERATIONAL TEA TOPIC-COLLEGE: IS IT WORTH IT?

President Ronda Sanders welcomed all members of the sponsoring groups joining AAUW members for this special event. The Associated Students UOP, Delta Sigma Theta Sorority Inc., The National Council of Negro Women- Sacramento Valley Section, and the Pacific Alumni Association were in attendance.

Guests attending were Kathy Miller, and Yvonne Flores, Student Body President at Delta College. In June AAUW sponsored two young women, Andrea Paulk, a bio-chemistry major at SJDC and Cecilia Carrillo, a computer engineering major at UOP. They were given scholarships to attend the National Conference of College Women Student Leaders at the University of Maryland. Andrea spoke of the inspiration and confidence she gained from this experience and thanked members for the opportunity. Panel discussion -College is it Worth it ? Marshea Pratt introduced the guest speakers while Dr. Lisa Cooper became the Moderator for the panel discussion. The panel discussed challenges experienced by women of diversity with respect for their cultures, an age span that covered a few generations (92-24), and the decisions these women made before entering college and their determination to complete their education. Financial support was an important issue in their education years just as it is for today's students.

The panel members were Mrs. United America of 2014, Parlisha Watts- Andrews, the Honorable Judge Ann M. Chargin, Esperanza Martinez Vielma, and Beverly Fitch McCarthy. Important points were made. For example, Esperanza felt that women need to be informed, early on, about how to apply for scholarships in order to survive the heavy costs of an education. Parlisha felt that the world opens up to you when you have a college background. Ann Chargin advised that it was never too late to earn a college degree. All agreed that college is absolutely worth the time and the financial investment. As Beverly concluded, "A college education is something that no one can ever take away from you."

The meeting was adjourned at 4 p.m.

"Macy's." The word prompts visions of fashions, furniture, kitchenware, cosmetics—just about anything for home and personal use. But books? Yes, the nation-wide department store provides money to national Reading Is Fundamental, which in turn offers grants to local organizations, like AAUW, with which books can be purchased. With our \$2,000 Macy's grant, Stockton Branch was able to order over 1,000 books in early summer.

And what interesting, beautiful, and varied books they were! Ordered from five different vendors, they included gorgeous hardback volumes about baby animals and dinosaurs, fanciful tales of fairies and goblins, non-fiction works about nature, and stories describing how kids face life's challenges. There were hardbacked treasures and soft-backed pleasures.

The Macy's books were mingled with previouslyordered volumes and offered to over 1,300 kindergarten through sixth grade youngsters at four Stockton Unified schools. The fall distributions were conducted by AAUW—RIF Liaisons Sharon Marr (Van Buren), Pam Mallett-Jones (Grunsky), and Cindy Milford (Kennedy and TLC's school). AAUW RIF Committee volunteers Joni Bean and Lynda Wong assisted with the Grunsky distribution.

Happily, some books from the Macy's grant remain for the winter distribution when they can delight more children as they foster literacy! Thank you, Macy's!
