




Where Equal Pay Flourished (and Failed) in 2016

Six states passed important Equal Pay Legislation this year-California, Maryland, Delaware, Massachusetts, Nebraska and Utah. When this year's sessions began in state houses across the country, 24 state legislatures had introduced bills that addressed the gender pay gaps in different forms. As the sessions progressed the number introducing equal pay legislation raised to 36 states and District of Columbia.

The six states that passed some legislation showed some activity in states red, blue and purple and realized that the pay gap was something real.

Nationally Congress passed the Lilly Ledbetter Act 2009, reducing the time that an appeal could be made. The act was in part a reaction to a Supreme Court decision limiting time to file a complaint.

Congress has been trying to pass a Federal Pay Check Fairness Act since 1963.

The Legion of Honor: *Monet: the Early Years*High on the headlines above the Golden Gate, stands the California Palace of the Legion of Honor.
The Legion of Honor will be hosting *Monet: The Early Years* in 2017.

Monet: The Early Years will be the first major US exhibition devoted to the initial phase of Claude Monet's career which spanned 1840 – 1926. Through approximately sixty paintings, the exhibition illustrates his unique style, which utilized painting textures and interplay of light, developed during the years 1858 to 1872.

This exhibition is a once-in-a-lifetime opportunity to experience Monet's mastery before Impressionism. The collection is a selection of works gathered from some of the most important international collections – the Musee d'Orsay in Paris, the National Gallery of Art in Washington D.C., the Metropolitan Museum of Art in New York and other public and private collections.

For lunch or refreshments, there is the Legion of Honor Café. Additionally, there is a wonderful gift shop.

Afterwards, enjoy a no-host lunch at the famous Phil's Fish Market and Eatery, a rustic scene with an extensive menu. In the afternoon, visit the Elkhorn Slough National Estuarine Reserve Visitor's Center to hear more about the sloughs' history and view habitats of the wildlife that live in this beautiful inlet. The Department of Museum Travel Wednesday, June 21st, 2017 The Allied Art Guild (Menlo Park) and the Cantor Art Center (Stanford University)

The Allied Art Guild is a beautiful and historic garden, home to unique shops, artists' studios, and the Blue Garden Café. This oasis is owned and operated by the Allied Arts Guild Auxillary. Their mission is to raise fund to support uncompensated care at Lucile Parkard Children's Hospital. The Artisan Shop at Allied Arts is staffed entirely by volunteers, and all their profists are donated to the hospital.

Lunch will be available at the Blue Garden Café. The meal is not included in the fee. After lunch, the bus will transport us to the Cantor Arts Center at Stanford University.

Founded in 1891, this historic museum was expanded and renamed I 1999 for lead donors, Iris and B. Gerald Cantor. The Center's collection expands 5,000 years and includes more than 45,000 artworks – allowing visitors to travel the globe from antiquity to present day. There are 24 galleries and many special exhibitions.

In addition to a wonderful gift shop, there is refreshment available at the Center's Cool Café. Which highlight Stanford University student artworks and overlooks the Rodin Garden.
