

STEM Trek



Unlike years past, there are many choices available to them: Special programs offering an emphasis in such things as health care or technology, charter schools offering rigorous academic programs as well as the traditional comprehensive high school programs. Mentors attempt to work with our students to insure the best fit for them.

At the same time our seniors have already filed their applications for college and are waiting "on pins and needles" for the decisions. They are turning their attention to a search for funding including scholarships, loans and grants. If any branch members know of a funding source, please share that with us.

Our January group activity was held at the Life First Training Center where the girls learned about job skills such as resumes, interviews, applications, etc. Some of our girls are looking for part time jobs now. Again, if you know of one please contact us.

A Little Bird Told You!

The RIF Bird sang passionately:



"Children need books that are free. So mail in your dollars And create little scholars By increasing kids 'literacy!"

Yes, it's February and RIF fundraising time again. In the second week of February, check your mail for a legal-size white envelope from AAUW-Stockton with a bird face (eyes and beak) on the front. Don't toss it! There's a 47cent songbird stamp inside and directions on how to win a \$25 Early Bird prize (a gift card from Trader Joe's). More important, you'll be guided in how to respond to the Little RIF Bird's plea for help.

RIF is America's oldest and largest literacy nonprofit, managed locally since 1978 by AAUW—Stockton Branch. Federal funding evaporated in 2012, so K-5 and K-6 (varying with the venue and the distribution date) students at four underserved Stockton schools rely on donations from individuals like you, as well as grant money when available. In the school year 2015-16, over 1,350 children chose books at two distributions at an average cost of \$2/book. Students shared reasons they love RIF: "I never liked to read until now!" "I now can read with my family." These comments illustrate how your RIF dollars advance literacy and the love of reading!
