
I hope that everyone had a happy holiday season. For me, the December AAUW branch meeting was one of the best ever! Peggy Guttieri's idea to have the meeting at the San Joaquin Historical Museum was brilliant. I'm looking forward to the winter and spring 2015 meetings that she and her co-program vice president Pat Hague are planning.

This is the time of year for reflection, resolution and prediction. For reflection, I reread my president's message in the January 2014 Steamer and was glad to see that we made great progress in the year 2014. AAUW Stockton Branch added 23 new members. Home Tour 2014 was a resounding success with 430 tickets sold. This is only 4 fewer tickets than were sold in 2013. Not since 2004 and 2005 have the number of tickets sold been in the 400's. Seems like we are doing something right!

Our local college partnerships are stronger than ever. We now have nearly 300 students enrolled as e-student affiliates. For the first time, along with a Pacific student, we sent a Delta College student to the National Conference of College Women Student Leaders (NCCWSL). Andrea Paulk from Delta College gave a most inspiring speech about her NCCWSL experience at the Intergenerational Tea that AAUW Stockton cosponsored at University of the Pacific in October.


The winner of the 2014 Stockton Branch contest went on to represent us and win at the State level! Once again, Stockton Branch has proven to be outstanding in the State!

# NATIONAL WOMEN'S HISTORY MUSEUM

Good news for the National Women's History Museum! For several years, many have been trying to get support from Congress to build a museum on or near the National Mall in Washington, DC, to honor the role of women in our national life and culture. Support for this project has been included in legislation just passed by both the House and Senate and contained in the Department of Defense Authorization package. The legislation creates a Congressional Commission to develop a feasibility plan for building of this museum. The museum will be funded by private donations. No federal funds will be used.

Major support for this mission came from a bipartisan group of women legislators.





The Invention of Wings - Sue Monk Kidd

Inspired by the true story of early-19<sup>th</sup>-century abolitionist and suffragist Sarah Grimké, Kidd paints a moving portrait of two women inextricably linked by the horrors of slavery-Sarah, daughter of a wealthy South Carolina plantation owner, and Handful, a slave in the Grimké household. Told in first-person, the chapters alternate between the two main characters' perspectives as we follow their unlikely friendship (characterized by both respect and resentment) from childhood to middle age. While their pain and struggle cannot be equated, both women strive to be set free—Sarah from the bonds of patriarchy and Southern bigotry, and Handful from the inhuman bonds of slavery.
