"Get it?" This is the question that often follows one of my grandchildren's attempts to explain something. Often, when I try to explain the problem of the pay gap between men and women, I have the urge to follow up with that question. On April 14th, we will acknowledge Equal Pay Day, 2015. This is this year's day that marks how many more days it takes on average for women in the US to earn what men earned the previous year.

On that day, AAUW Stockton Branch will staff an information table at the DeRosa University Center at University of the Pacific from 11am to 2pm. We will be handing out information, along with cookies that have 23% broken off to symbolize the average 23% less pay that women in the US make compared to men. We are coordinating our efforts with AAUW Lodi Branch, which will be doing the same at San Joaquin Delta College.

"Get it?" In the United States, 40% of households have a woman as the primary bread winner. Equal Pay is everyone's issue. If the man of the house loses his job, as happened too often in the recent recession, many families become dependent on the woman's earnings. Enlightened men want equal pay for the women in their lives. In March we welcomed six such enlightened men who have become members of AAUW! I can confidently say that these men "Get it"!

STEM Trek



A LOOK AT THE GENDER PAY GAP

Imagine you work at an entry level job alongside someone who has less experience than you but still makes more money. Maybe you become a supervisor, yet still take home less pay than the employees that you manage. Years go by and you look back at a lifetime of work and realize you lost hundreds of thousands of dollars in earnings. This is real life for women working in the United States, where women are the primary source of income for 40 percent of families.

In its report, The Simple Truth About the Gender Pay Gap, the American Association of University Women, using the most current statistics from the Bureau of Labor Statistics and the Census Bureau, concluded that:

- *The pay gap has barely budged in a decade.
- *Women in every state experience the gap, but some states are worse than others.
- *The pay gap is worse for women of color.
- *Women face a pay gap in nearly every occupation.
- *The pay gap grows with age.
- *While more education is an effective tool for increasing earnings, it is not an effective tool against the gender pay gap.
- *The pay gap also exists for women without children.

*How Has Your LAF Contribution Supported **Equity?**


One way is the Case Support Program. 2014, LAF supported several cases in financial and non-financial ways.

>LAF offered funding for court filing fees; for preparation of briefs; and for plaintiff court travel. >LAF offered non-financial support by signing amicus briefs; by offering official statements of support; by having AAUW members present in court or at rallies.

A successful example of the Case Support Program backing plaintiffs who challenged gender discrimination is the Feather River Community College Cases (2007-2014). college faculty had been punished for reporting Title IX violations and sexual harassment. After eight years of suits and appeals, a 2009 decision in the plaintiffs' favor was upheld on November 19th, 2014. This case is important because it demonstrates that civil rights laws are only effective if they are enforced! faculty and staff willing to fight for fairness, laws like Title IX will lose their power!

Paid Family Leave

The State of California paid family leave policy was recently changed to cover more individuals. The program, first enacted in 2002, is part of the State's extended disability insurance (State Disability Insurance/SDI/) for individuals. An amendment in 2013 expanded eligibility to cover

more people. The program is financed through employee payroll withholdings.

The insurance provides compensation to a family member who takes time off work to care for a seriously ill child, spouse, parent, domestic partner or to bond with a new child or a child in connection with adoption or foster care placement. A family member can also be a grandparent, grandchild, parent-in-law or sibling.

Please tell family and friends about paid family leave provisions of the State Disability Insurance (SD) program. A recent survey revealed that less than a third of Californians are aware of the paid family leave program.
