

Draw It Out, a Stockton non-profit group that creates art events to raise awareness of the effects of violence in our community is reaching out to local AAUW members to seek artists for the March 2016 exhibit "Not One More - Art Against Violence." Artists of all ages, working in all media, are invited to create pieces that explore how violence impacts their family, neighborhood, school or community, and ways to change a culture of violence to one of communication and tolerance.

The show will exhibit two and threedimensional art including painting, drawing, sculpture, photography, video, garden art, banners, quilts, needlepoint and wearable art. Music, dance and spoken word entries are also invited. The "Not One More" exhibit will run for the entire month of March in the Plants and Flowers Building at the San Joaquin County Fairgrounds. Admission is free, and guided tours are available for groups, such as local schools and colleges, religious organizations, retirement communities, veterans' posts and service organizations.

The exhibit will feature four special events: an Artists' Reception on March 6^{th} , a Spoken Word Event on March 11^{th} , an Afternoon of Music and Dance on March 20^{th} , and a Panel on Art Activism on March 31^{st} .

The art show is sponsored by Draw It Out. DIO is affiliated with Cleveland School Remembers, an organization primarily composed of teachers and others who experienced the 1989 Stockton elementary school yard shooting, which left five young children dead and 30 injured. CSR works toward a reduction of gun violence. Both DIO and CSR have members who also belong to the AAUW.



San Joaquin County Commission on the Status of Women

Susan B. Anthony *Women of Achievement* Awards

Nomination packets are now available for those wishing to nominate San Joaquin County women for the prestigious Susan B. Anthony Women of Achievement Award.

Women who have excelled in their fields and raised the status of humankind may be nominated by an individual, organization, or business. The sponsoring organization, the San Joaquin County Commission on the Status of Women, will present no more than 10 women the coveted honor at the 41st annual banquet in February. An additional Young Feminist Award may be granted.

Only those whose volunteer efforts, in addition to professional work and volunteer efforts, are judged to have raised the status of humankind in the county will be considered. Categories include business, community service, creative education, government and politics, arts. homemaking, law and legal services, labor and emplovment. health care, media, peace. religion, research, science, sports, women's rights, and women's services. Award candidates must be current county residents or employed full-time in the county.

The Young Feminist of Achievement honor was established to honor women less than 30 years

of age. Only one award is given annually, if suitable candidates have been nominated.


