Mid-term elections don't usually attract as much attention as those in a Presidential election year. However, in California we will be choosing a new governor as well as deciding on senatorial, congressional, state legislative, and local elections this year. We also have numerous bond measures and other ballot propositions generated by the legislature or public interest groups. Often, the wording of these propositions makes it difficult to decipher exactly what we're voting for or against.

For many years, the League of Women Voters has worked diligently to analyze the various ballot initiatives and, in effect, "translate " them so that voters can be sure to have an informed understanding of public policy issues.

October's AAUW branch meeting will feature members of the League of Women Voters, who will explain the eleven ballot measures we will be deciding on in November. There will also be a question/answer opportunity.


