

Updates on Public Policies

It is up to AAUW members to act on priority issues that affect human rights. To contact your senator, call the Congressional Switchboard at 1-866-327-8670. Other ways of contacting your representatives are through email or by calling their office. Five constituent contacts will cause a legislator to pay serious attention to a given issue.

Title IX

Several bills related to protecting and enabling females to be accorded equal rights have been introduced (H.R.4030, H.R.6184, Senate Bill 2110). These bills cover not only higher education, but also elementary and secondary schools. They would set up the Office of Gender Equity within the Dept. of Education that would provide guidelines and specifications for filing complaints.

Affordable Care Act (ACA)

In 2014, the Supreme Court defined ACA as a tax rather than a mandate. In this ruling, the Supreme Court eliminated the penalty for not having health care insurance that will take effect

in the 2019 tax year. The decision also ruled that Medicaid Expansion was optional for states. 36 states have opted in for expanded Medicaid; while 14 states have opted out of the Medicaid expansion. It is estimated that since ACA took effect in 2010, the number of people with health insurance increased by more than 20 million. The number of citizens with health insurance remain at about 2009 numbers in states that opted out of Medicaid expansion. Popular provisions of ACA are mandating insurance coverage for persons with preexisting conditions, preventing insurers from charging sick people more or denying them because of their conditions, and allowing young adults under 26 to remain on their parents' insurance coverage.

Reproductive Health

The Trump administration requires ACA insurers to show reproductive services separate from other services on forms subsidized by tax payer dollars. In addition, it also proposed to let employers deny contraceptive coverage in their plans for employees. West Virginia dropped Medicaid funding to clinics that terminate pregnancies and assigned jail time performing or receiving abortion services. However, the criminalization of reproductive health rights can only happen if Roe v. Wade is overturned. On Dec. 10, 2018, the US Supreme Court left lower court victories intact for Planned Parenthood in a legal battle with states over access by Medicaid patients to the group's services. The dispute did not involve federal funding for abortion-related services that is barred by federal law. It involves an effort by Kansas & Louisiana to block Medicaid contracts Planned Parenthood for providina preventive care to low income women, such as cancer screenings, prenatal services, control, and ultrasounds.

Gun Control

The "3-D Firearms prohibitions Act" (H.R.7115) was introduced to the House on Nov. 2, 2018, to prohibit the sale, marketing or advertising on any medium of electronic communications, acquisition, distribution in commerce, or import of automatic and semiautomatic weapons. It shall ban the sale of machinegun parts kits, conversion kits and ammunition for machine guns and assault weapons. It also requires homemade firearms to have serial numbers.
